

ABOUT SCHOOL

Suncity School, Sector-37D, is spread over five acres of land, in the heart of New Gurugram with easy access to Dwarka and all of Gurugram . Its state of the art infrastructure makes it one of its kind in the area. Suncity is a co - educational school, engendering gender parity, mutual respect for and among all members of the institution and has a strict non - discrimination policy on the basis of sex, religion, creed or class. In adopting the cultural ideology of 'Collaboration' Suncity makes all the stakeholders- Students, Teachers and Parents equal partners in the process of learning. We empower students to take on active roles in their own progress and build within them the intrinsic ethos of 'Sanksaars' and uniquely engage them while promoting a culture reinforcing the joy of lifelong learning and meaningful existence. Suncity School is a K-12 school and it has ,in its 1st year, opened admissions for students from Pre - Nursery to Grade 8 for year 2020-21. The average class strength from Pre Nursery – Kindergarten is 20 students and the teacher student ratio is 1:10, thus facilitating individualized attention. Grade 1 onwards the average class strength is 24 students, ably managed by the Class Teacher and other faculty members.

❖ INFRASTRUCTURE WITH IMAGES

SMART CLASSROOM

All classrooms at Suncity School are ergonomic in design – modern in look and feel, as well as allowing optimum natural light to filter in through large windows, creating a pleasant ambience. The state of the art classrooms are all equipped with the following features:

- Air conditioned, with air purifiers to optimize hygiene.
- Smart Boards with internet connectivity, to access information and share homework.
- Display boards with dedicated space to share information and work done by the students – for eg. – weekly quizzes, house and club information etc.
- Twin sharing desks : Aesthetically designed desks and seating spaces to seat students comfortably.

The school has 4 state of the art laboratories.

- Integrated Science Lab- Well-equipped with specimens, models and apparatus This helps in inculcating in our students inquisitiveness and scientific temper for interactive hands on learning
- ICT Lab- The IB Matrix Lab equipped with work stations and desktops caters to the needs of students from Grades III to V.
- The Linguistic Lab- used for language enhancement in young children Grade V onwards where they begin studying a new language.

- The TAB lab- used by students of EYP – mainly Grades I & II, to enhance and hone their IT skills. There tab stations and each station is equipped with four I Pads allowing the children to exercise their imagination through age appropriate software, under the guidance of a mentor.

LIBRARY WITH E-FACILITY

The abode of knowledge lies in the aesthetically designed library in Suncity School with a fully automated e-library. The Librarian is always available to recommend as well as help the children in choosing books aligned with their varied interests. Access to the e library makes it easy for parents to guide their children in identifying books they want to borrow every week. The well – stocked library with its state of the art computing facilities enables access to unlimited online study resources for independent research and in – depth learning. The Resource room adjacent to the library is stocked with reference books for use by both students and staff. A video screening room contiguous to the library screens films and documentaries related to students' scholastic and co scholastic development. The library and its conjuncts are hubs for browsing, reading and learning which reinforce the unique ASK methodology followed by the school – Application, Skill and knowledge.

MULTIPURPOSE HALL

The school aims at the all-round development of the students by promoting a number of co-curricular activities. The hall aesthetically designed, well equipped with a stage area, the latest sound and lighting systems, is an intrinsic part of the school where the cultural life of the institution flourishes. It has a capacity to accommodate 700 people. It has a height of 33 feet and 6 badminton courts can be housed simultaneously .

INFIRMARY

The well-being of a child is of foremost importance at Suncity School, whether it be physical or emotional and the school infirmary addresses both effectively. The infirmary is well equipped with necessary medical equipment and managed by a resident doctor and nurse during school hours.

They are responsible for promptly attending to illness and injury during school timings. The doctor conducts a bi yearly check - up, spread over each academic semester, for all students.

Guidance and Counselling

Adjunct to the infirmary, a professional counselor is available to support students and address their concerns . The counselor ensures confidentiality and is equipped to cater to the child's psychological or emotional needs by providing counseling/ guidance through individual sessions or collaborative discussions. The Counselor also addresses specific learning difficulties. A sound mind and body is the key to the development of a child and we at Suncity School are ever vigilant regarding the welfare of both!

REFECTORY

The refectory, used for communal meals, is at the heart of Suncity School – where students and staff connect with each other outside the classroom in an atmosphere of bonhomie. Equipped with an open kitchen, the daily food is cooked adhering to the most stringent parameters of hygiene and cleanliness. The food served from four bain-marie counters, segregated thoughtfully according to classes, is planned by a nutritionist, which ensures a balanced diet. A main station is dedicated to the preparation of specialized meals to cater to all.

The Elementary Years Programme (EYP) students are served by the nannies and waiters on tables laid out properly with tablemats, crockery and cutlery. Grace is said before commencement of the meal and the students are accompanied by their home - room tutors who gently facilitate them in the usage of cutlery and mentor them about good eating habits, table manners and zero wastage of food. The students are encouraged to eat independently and, also, learn to put away used crockery and cutlery on steel trolleys placed at one end of the refectory.

Students of Grades 1 and above need to carry coupons to school to avail the food served in the refectory. Self - service is mandatory, however all students are entitled to ask for extra helpings.

The importance of fire safety was highlighted by citing real-life examples; use of fire fighting gadgets was demonstrated by the team to help students understand and act on time during a fire breakout situation. The students were made to use fire fighting gadgets to help them practically understand how they function. Mnemonics were used to make them remember the steps viz. PASS RACE (Pull Aim Squeeze Sideways; Rescue Alarm Confined and Extinguish). To register this information in mind, the session was followed by a Q 'n' A session and reflection sheet. Ms.Guneet Ohri, the Principal, thanked the team of officials and inspired the students to respond swiftly during such emergency situations.

A plethora of activities were conducted that reiterated and strengthened the students' understanding. The activities planned ranged from clock making, poster making on road safety, hands-on experiments related to weather & water, creating terrariums, data handling on air pollution, creating anchor charts depicting their understanding of Math & Science concepts, making clay models and understanding how sound travels in waves were some of the many activities that were undertaken during the subject integration week. The whole week gave our students an insight that subjects are transdisciplinary and learning is across various subject domains.
